#### Overview

TUMI is an international coalition assisting 20 global cities to create world-leading electric bus fleets in the next five years:

- The Transformative Urban Mobility Initiative (TUMI) is launching an international platform to accelerate adoption of electric buses in the Global South
- The TUMI E-Bus Mission will inspire and support 500+ cities to cumulatively electrify at least 100,000 transit buses
